

What is WeXchange?

Established in 2013 by IDB Lab, WeXchange is a platform that seeks to unleash the growth potential of women entrepreneurs in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics) in Latin America and the Caribbean. WeXchange seeks to bring together women entrepreneurs from different communities and environments with three main objectives:

P

Recognize and strengthen women entrepreneurs.



Connect them with mentors, investors, models to follow, and other successful women entrepreneurs.



Increase their opportunities for success and their access to financing through the creation of a support network and democratization of essential tools to grow their business.

Since its beginnings, WeXchange has organized an annual forum that offers the region's women entrepreneurs the opportunity to broaden their network of contacts, access mentors and investors, and receive trainings on key topics to develop their startups, as well as the possibility to participate in the Pitch Competition, a competition that aims to recognize the most dynamic and innovative women entrepreneurs in the region.



Today, WeXchange is the largest platform connecting women STEM entrepreneurs with mentors and investors in Latin America and the Caribbean. It employs multiple components to fulfill its mission of encouraging women STEM entrepreneurs in the region.





01. Annual WeXchange Forum

The WeXchange Forum is the main event on the WeXchange platform. It is held annually in a different Latin American or Caribbean country. The two-day conference brings together entrepreneurs, mentors, investors, and other actors in the entrepreneurial ecosystem, who

participate in activities such as networking, mentoring sessions, trainings, inspirational talks, and panels on different topics, and they attend the Pitch Competition finale. In 2020, the eighth edition of the Annual WeXchange Forum was held virtually.

02. Women STEMpreneurs Competition

Each year, before the annual forum, WeXchange launches a competition to recognize the most dynamic women STEM entrepreneurs in the region and connect them with potential investors.

The 2020 edition of the competition was organized by Angel Ventures. It had two categories, depending on the companies' phase of development and fundraising goal:

- Seed Category
- Pre-Series A to Series B Category





It is important to understand the needs of your project at every moment; this will enable you to identify areas that need strengthening through mentoring.



Take advantage of, and respect, your time and that of your mentor. Arrive on time to your sessions and come prepared with the topics that you would like to discuss.



Clearly identify what a mentor can give you based on their experience and take maximum advantage of their knowledge.



Try to create a long-term relationship with your mentor through open and honest dialogue.

Women entrepreneurs and experts gathered for an interactive dialogue and a free exchange of views. The purpose was to provide women entrepreneurs with feedback and recommendations, key concepts related to their sectors, trends, and contacts. Each woman entrepreneur assigned an hour-long mentoring session which she shared with peers, taking into consideration the stage of development and the business model of each company. Following the first session, the women entrepreneurs attended the second virtual round table.

The first round was divided into sectors, such as agtech, fintech, edtech, e-commerce, biotech, and healthtech, and others. The second round was structured based on different topics, such as business models, marketing strategy, raising capital, regional expansion, managing teams, and company finances.

MAKING NEW CONNECTIONS:



Like in previous editions, the WeXchange 2020 Forum made time for networking so that the women entrepreneurs could create solid and lasting relationships that would help them as their companies grow. These networking opportunities were repeated at various times throughout the Forum.

DAY 2: OPEN DAY FOR THE ENTREPRENEURIAL ECOSYSTEM

Mauricio Claver-Carone, President of the IDB Group, and Irene Arias Hofman, CEO of IDB Lab, opened the second day of WeXchange 2020, a different kind of edition, and one filled with excitement about the format and the context.

The eighth edition of the WeXchange Forum convened more than 720 entrepreneurs and key actors from throughout the region. For the first time in eight years, it was held virtually.

Keynote Fireside Chat:The Rise of Female Co-Founded Unicorns in Latin America

Tomas Lopes -Teixeira, CIO of IDB Lab, spoke with Loreanne García, Co-founder and CPO of Kavak, and Mariana Paixão, Co-founder of Loft, about their experience building companies that today are valued at more than US\$1 billion. Both women entrepreneurs agreed on the importance of thinking disruptively.

They emphasized that the conventional mindset only sees what the majority sees. Disruptive thinking, on the other hand, sees what no one else can see. This type of reasoning is key to turning any startup into a unicorn company. They encouraged the participants to enjoy the ride as founders.
